The BTS originated as the Toxicology Club (1971-1979)

The Club was a discussion forum for toxicology. 200 members formed 'The British Toxicology Society 'which was constituted formally in April 1979.

John Barnes Lecture (1979 –) Director of the MRC Toxicology Unit, Carshalton, Surrey. Established in honor of his pioneering work on the scientific basis for Toxicology.


Paton Prize, (1994 -) a bequest from Sir William Paton for scholarship in historical aspects of toxicology


