

Fellowship application form

<p>Background</p>	<p>Fellows of the British Toxicology Society (FBTS) are members who have demonstrated distinction and peer recognition in Toxicology.</p> <p>There are currently 60 Fellows listed on the BTS website, all of whom have made, and continue to make, substantial contributions to the discipline of Toxicology through their work, publication and presentation of research, leadership, and contribution to the Society.</p>
<p>Entitlement</p>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • To use FBTS after their name • To receive a Fellowship certificate • To have their names published on the BTS Website (with permission)
<p>Cost</p>	<p>Fellows will pay the same rate as ordinary members (i.e. full member or retired member).</p> <p>Fellows who no longer pay a BTS subscription are entitled to use the term FBTS (retired). In this instance the term "retired" is defined as either retired from active professional life or retired from the BTS whilst possibly remaining active in another scientific discipline.</p>
<p>What is required to make a nomination?</p>	<p>Candidates must have been a Full Member of the Society for at least seven years and be supported by two existing full members ("Proposers"). At least one of whom shall be a Fellow of the Society.</p> <p>Candidates must demonstrate distinction and peer recognition in toxicology. The normal criteria are:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Substantial contribution to the Society, demonstrated by committee work, contribution to outreach work for the Society and/or attendance at, and contribution to, Society meetings • Contribution to toxicology (demonstrated by career progression and publication record in suitable journals) or, for those in industry or outside mainstream research, by references from Fellows or Full Members <p>The application must be completed by the candidate, along with a one-two -page CV. The application form includes a statement explaining the candidate's achievements relevant to the criteria for Fellowship, covering the following headings:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Contributions to the Society • Evidence of engagement in the practice of toxicology. • Details of the past 12 months relevant CPD activities

<p>What happens once a proposal is submitted?</p>	<p>All applications will be considered by the Fellowship Committee.</p> <p>The Fellowship Committee is made up of President, Vice President, Immediate Past President (Chair of the Nominations Sub Committee), General Secretary and Chair of the Scientific Sub-Committee. The President will report the recommendations of new Fellows to the Executive Committee meeting, held in September/October of each year, for approval.</p> <p>The decisions taken by the Executive Committee are final.</p> <p>Successful candidates will be notified after the Executive Committee meeting, and usually by 31 October.</p>
