

EUROTOX 2021: Registration for <u>EUROTOX 2021</u> is currently underway. The time of the meeting has been extended to facilitate the virtual format of the event. The virtual congress will be held **27 September until 1 October 2021** in the afternoons and early evening to accommodate participants from around the world. The <u>scientific programme</u> includes merit and plenary lectures, as well as an exhibition and industry sponsored sessions. <u>Continuing Education Courses (CEC)</u> will be held in the mornings to allow everyone an opportunity to attend these and the main meeting.
